National Health Service Fellowship talk June 2023

Speaker: Chris Dawson Morris, Deputy Director of Strategy, Planning and Partnership.

Local Health Services and Grange University Hospital

To begin his presentation, Chris outlined what he described as the Aneurin Bevan Health Board's vision and ambition.

A primary aim of the Health Board is to reduce health inequalities across the health board area. To illustrate this, he said that the difference in healthy life expectancy, between the poorest sections of some communities and the most affluent sections, had now increased to an extra 21 years of healthy life, attained by the better off populations within the health board.

To achieve that aim the health board were working towards providing support for the different stages in an individual's life.

• Support as child, and this starts with maternity services.

- Support the transition between childhood and becoming an adult.
- Support for individuals during their working life
- Support for individuals in later life and with an emphasis on care for the elderly, including end-of-life care.
 These aims can only be achieved by co-operation with different agencies, in particular social services and social care. He detailed the Board's plans for each of the stages set out above, which included the practical steps to achieve the immediate goals of;
- Improving cancer services
- Reducing waiting lists
 - Improving mental health services To achieve these goals it will be essential in the long term, to educate people about a healthy life style and taking control for their own well-being.
 - Chris then asked the audience who thought Grange Hospital was doing a good job; not many hands were raised.
 - He then explained that the Grange Hospital was unusual, in that as a project, it was delivered on time and on budget. It concentrated critical care and major services into one unit and this had resulted in an improvement in the care of the seriously ill.
 - He then explained concept of the risk-adjusted mortality index, (RAMI). Using this index, which has drastically reduced since the Grange Hospital opened, it can be shown that the care provided by the Aneurin Bevan Health Board has improved and is now one of the best in the UK. If you are seriously ill then you get excellent care at the Grange Hospital.
 - However, where the Grange fell down was getting patients through the system. The discharge of patients is being delayed by the lack of social care and this has the knock on effect of delays in admission. This results in ambulances waiting an acceptably long time outside the hospital. He stressed this is something that must improve. He outlined some of the ideas the Health Board is developing, to improve this aspect of care.

In the concluding part of his presentation he went on to tell us about projects that were nearing completion either this year or early next year;

- In Tredegar, the Bevan Health and Well-being Centre, built to hold GP services, Dental services and Local Authority services all under one roof, is due to open later this year.
- A similar unit is being built in Newport East and that will be completed early next year.
- The Endoscopy Unit at The Royal Gwent Hospital will have its capacity doubled by the end of this year. This will help to reduce the waiting times for cancer services.
- The Nevill Hall Hospital site is to house a new Satellite Radiotherapy Unit with the latest equipment, which will be partnered with a new Cancer Care Unit, again on the same site. The hub for these units will be at The Velindre Cancer Centre at Cardiff.

- There will be a Unified Breast Unit at Ystrad Ysbyty Fawr, which will open by the end of this year
- The developments for Mental Health Services and Services for Learning Disabilities are dependent on funding approval from the Welsh Government and services will be on the Grange Hospital site as well as the St. Cadoc's Hospital site.

He then asked for questions from the floor, and to be expected from an experienced and knowledgable audience, there were indeed many searching questions about capacities, staffing levels and recruitment, and the likelihood of health board achieving its aims.

Delyn Hunt then thanked Chris on behalf of the Fellowship, for coming to talk to us, and for his candid responses to some searching questions.
